

Please place any hats, scarves, gloves, mittens, socks or any other items of apparel offering winter warmth in the container in the lower lobby area by December 1st.



Children entering Second Grade through Sixth Grade can join **Ellinakia** Youth entering Seventh Grade through Twelfth Grade can join **Olympians**.


