

SATURDAY OF SOULS (PSYCHOSAVATO)

Traditionally, the Orthodox remember the dead on a Saturday, the day Christ lay in His tomb.

Four times a year, parishioners assemble to pray for all their deceased loved ones.

These general memorial services, known as Saturday of Souls take place the two Saturdays that precede the beginning of Great Lent, the First Saturday of Great Lent, and the Saturday before the Feast of Pentecost.

If you would like to offer prayers for the deceased,
write their first name(s) on a slip of paper
(or detach the one provided for you),
and the priest will read the list toward the end of the service.

Following the service all the *kollyva* is combined symbolizing the mixing of souls in heaven.

Parishioners share the *kollyva* and greet each other with,
"May God grant them rest---May their memory be eternal."

For Those In Need (FTIN) helps in St. Luke's outreach to the community, offering basic necessities such as food, school supplies, clothing, shelter, etc. to those in our local area who lack them. FTIN also works with other parish groups to provide discretionary assistance to fellow parishioners in need.

On Monday evening, *December 9th*, FTIN's *December Cook* prepared 165 dinners for The Life Center (Upper Darby) & The Salvation Army (Chester); thanks to all those FTIN volunteer Chefs who turned out! In addition, the following morning we also distributed about 100 meals prepared for Philoptochos Boutiques & Greek Treats thanks to the generosity of John Solomon and his staff; and with added thanks to Frank Pantazopoulos and Tiffany Bakery for their generous donation of a variety of apple, pumpkin and sweet potato pies. TLC was also the beneficiary that day of 100 place settings of excess dinnerware from Philoptochos, which TLC can then provide to those of its residents upon leaving to help set up housekeeping in a more permanent residence elsewhere.

Our February Cook is scheduled for Monday, FEB 10th @ 4:30pm.

FTIN once again thanks all who supported St. Luke's *Frozen* Turkey Drive by donating **145** Turkeys for distribution by the Salvation Army to families on its holiday food pantry register.

We extend our gratitude to all the FTIN members who filled the chapel for our *Christmas Gift Giving Shoppers* project. Thank you to the GOYA members who enthusiastically wrapped the 150+ gifts that were distributed to the Chester Housing Authority.

Update on FTIN's Annual Winter Apparel drive: the Domestic Abuse Project (DAP) was able to assist several families that had transitioned from protection program safe houses into independent living arrangements. The collection was so successful this year that our distribution was broadened to include The Life Center (TLC) as well. Both organizations were immensely grateful to St. Luke's Parishioners. Quoting from DAP's letter of thanks (to ALL of you) "" Your generosity directly provides survivors with some of the most basic necessities, helping to make their lives just a little easier. Thank you for helping those we serve. Together we are making a difference in our community.

Finally, FTIN continues to support the *Salvation Army's food pantry* with a particular emphasis on their **homeless & senior populations' needs**, with deliveries scheduled on a bi-monthly basis (Tuesday, FEB 4th this month).

ST. JOHN CHRYSOSTOM ORATORICAL FESTIVAL 2025 TOPICS **JUNIOR DIVISION**

(GRADES 7-9)

- 1. Philanthropy is an important part of the Church's mission. It involves more than giving money. Why is it important to support people in different ways besides just donating? In what ways can we offer support, and how can these other forms of help make a difference in the lives of individuals and the community?
- 2. In Psalm 4, we are told to "be angry, but sin not." Why would we be encouraged to beangry? How does anger fit into the life of an Orthodox Christian?
- 3. The Orthodox Church is filled with repetition: we sing "Lord, have mercy" dozens of times every service, we sing the Paschal Troparion all throughout Pascha, and we repeat the same Divine Liturgy every single time. What is the importance of repetition in the Orthodox Church?
- 4. The Russian Orthodox novelist, Fyodor Dostoevsky, once said that "Beauty will save the world." What is the role of beauty in the Church and in the world at large?
- 5. What is the symbolism of the liturgical vestments worn by a deacon, priest, and bishop, and how do these vestments reflect and correlate to their specific roles and responsibilities within the Divine Liturgy?

SENIOR DIVISION

(GRADES 10-12)

1. His All-Holiness, the Ecumenical Patriarch, is recognized as the highest Primate in the Church. This title signifies a unique leadership role within the Orthodox Church, where authority and primacy are balanced with equality among Patriarchs. Discuss the practical implications versus the theoretical aspects of His All-Holiness' role in the

Orthodox Church. What does it mean for him to be both "first among equals" and "first without equals"?

- 2. The Seven Ecumenical Councils are regarded as seven of the most important parts of Church History, which came after the completion of the Bible. Pick one of the Council's and explain why it is important.
- 3. The Bible is full of figures, both good and bad, who, while not talked about frequently, can be hugely helpful in understanding both salvation history and our place in it. Pick a lesser-known figure from the Bible, explain who they are, how they fit into the Biblical narrative, and what we can learn from them.
- 4. While every church building is different, there are specific guidelines and practices that describe how and why they are built the way they are. Research them and then explain their theological significance.


